## Paraphrased Text

---

**Article 5.** The United States will provide the Pawnee with one thousand dollars a year for ten years for schools. The president can decide how and when to provide these funds.

**Article 7.** The United States will provide each of the Pawnee bands with four farmers and will give each farmer one thousand dollars' worth of oxen and other farm animals. The farm animals will not be delivered to the Pawnee directly, however, until the president decides it is appropriate and safe.

**Article 8.** The United States will build one horse mill for grinding corn for each of the four Pawnee bands.

**Article 10.** The United States will not fulfill the promises in the fifth, seventh, and eighth articles until the Pawnee move to farming areas and continue to live there for one year. The U.S. will send teachers, farmers, and farm animals, and build mills for the Pawnee villages. By staying in the area for one year, the Pawnee will be able to protect the teachers, farmers, farm animals, and mill.
