Before settlers arrived, indigenous people of the Pacific Northwest maintained large areas of land with diverse ecosystems. In the 1970s the Muckleshoot Tribe was confined to a one-acre reservation. Today, the Muckleshoot Indian Tribe asserts its rights as a sovereign nation and has begun to buy back ancestral land to ensure food sovereignty.
